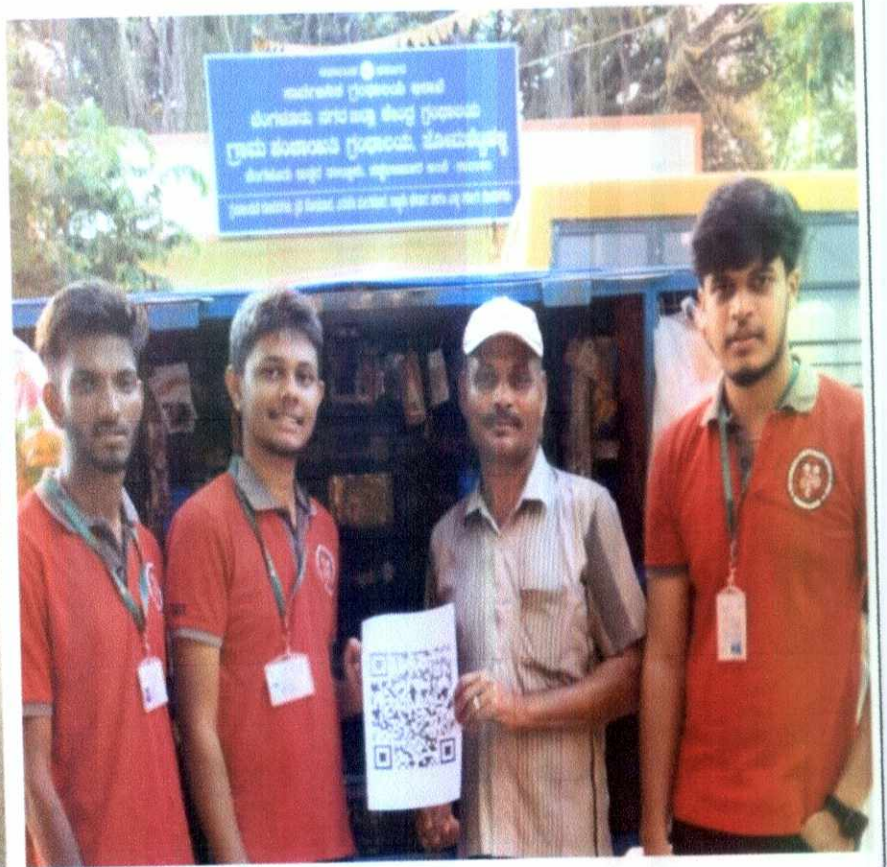

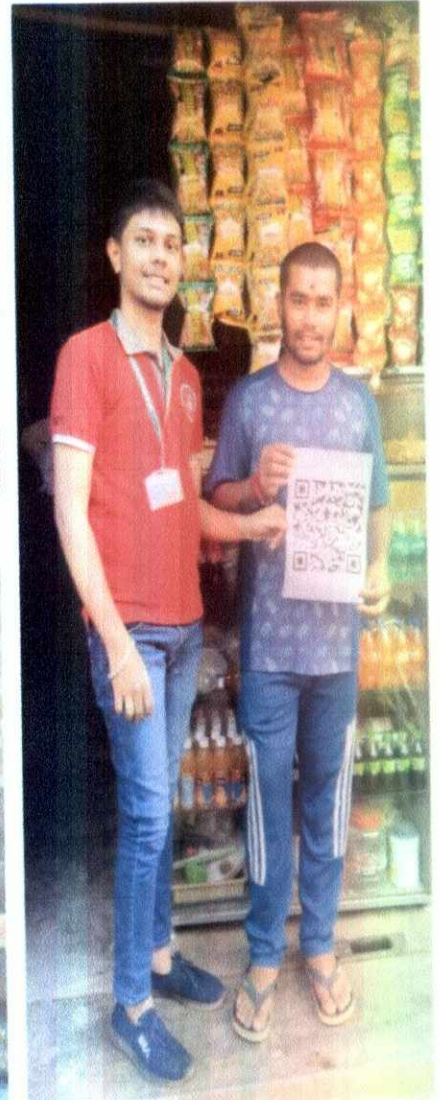
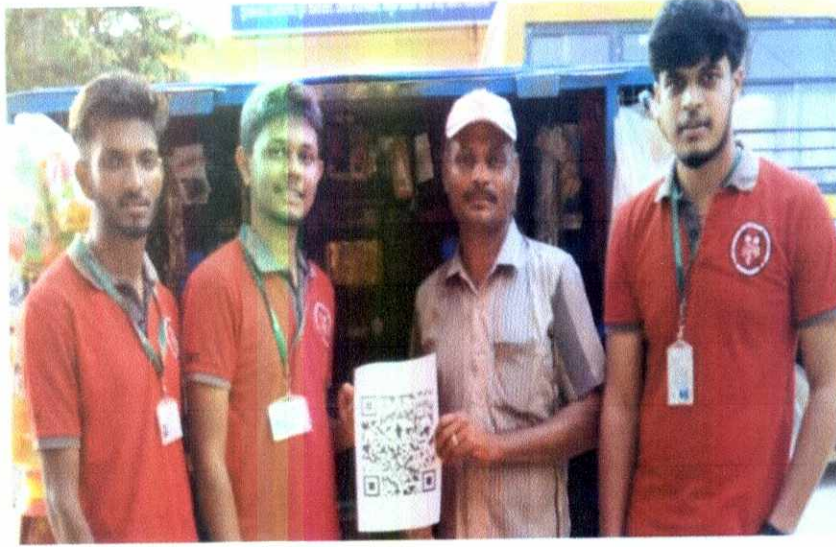
Brief Summary of the activity:-

A digital payment, sometimes called an electronic payment, is the transfer of value from one payment account to another using a digital device or channel. This definition may include payments made with bank transfers, mobile money, QR codes, and payment instruments such as credit, debit, and prXepaid cards.

Government of India is committed to expand digital transactions in the Indian economy, and thereby enhance the quality and strength of the financial sector, as well as ease of living for citizens. Digital payment transactions have significantly increased as a result of coordinated efforts of the Government as a whole, along with all stake holders concerned, from 2,071 crore transactions in FY 2017-18 to 8,840 crore transactions in FY 2021-22 (Source: RBI, NPCI and banks). During last five years, various easy and convenient modes of digital payments, including Bharat Interface for Money-Unified Payments Interface (BHIM-UPI), Immediate Payment Service (IMPS), and National Electronic Toll Collection (NETC) have registered substantial growth and have transformed digital payment ecosystem by increasing person-to-person (P2P) as well as person-to-merchant (P2M) payments. BHIM UPI has emerged as the preferred payment mode of the citizens and has recorded 803.6 crore digital payment transactions with the value of ₹ 12.98 lakh crore in January 2023.

It has been found out that digital payment modes considered are BHIM-UPI, IMPS, NACH, AePS, NETC, debit cards, credit cards, NEFT, RTGS, PPI and others. Source: RBI, NPCI and banks The total value of digital payments during the last five financial year and in the current financial year.

Digital payments are transactions that take place via digital or online modes, with no physical exchange of money involved. This means that both parties, the payer and the payee, use electronic mediums to exchange money.

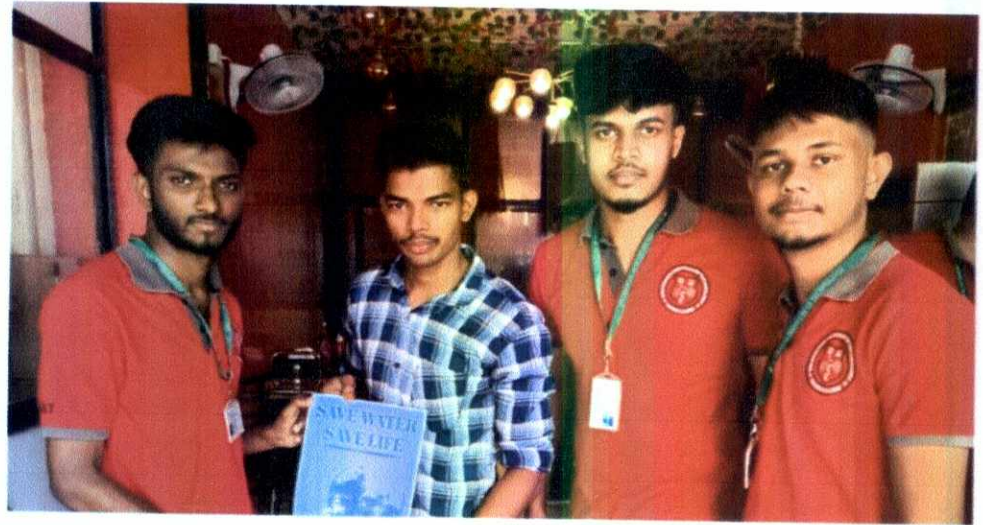
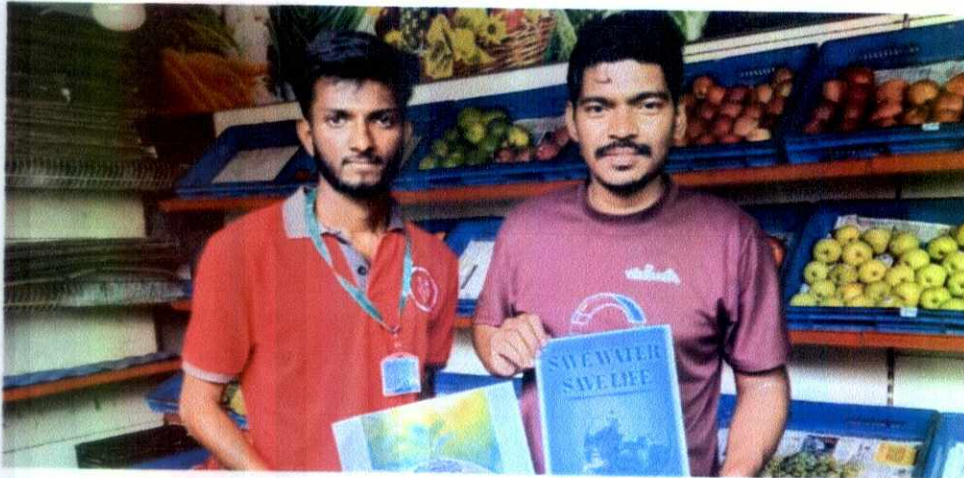
Brief Summary of the activity:

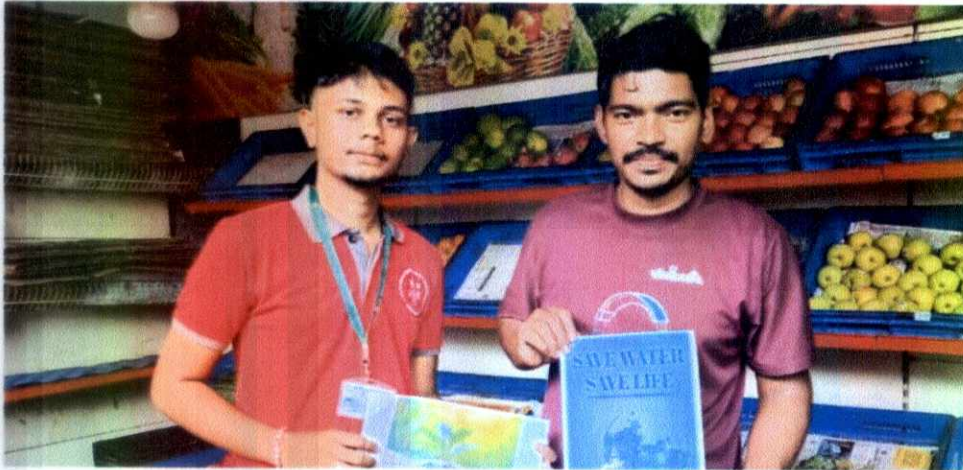

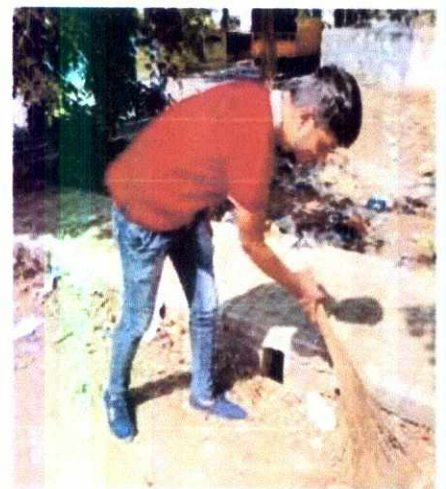




Outcome of the activity:

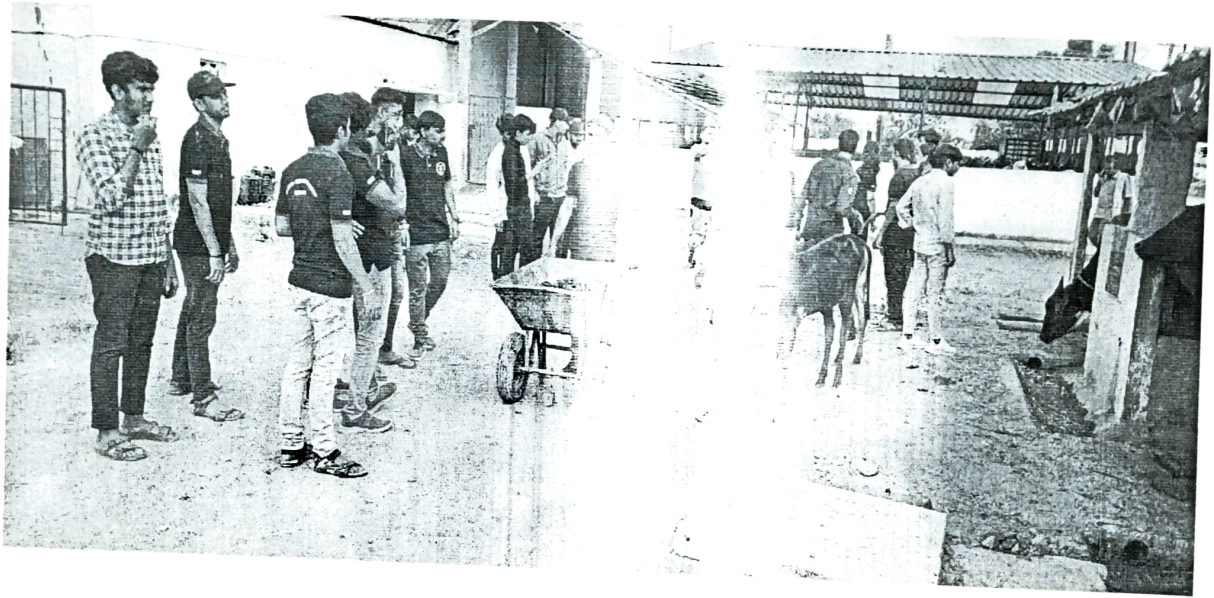
Sonu For People Foundation(R.)

Breakfast was provided to all which included Upma and Poha along with tea. Awareness programme was given by Raghu from Ashrama who explained about different breeds of cows. Also, they explained about how the gohar gas is generated and the decompost manure used as fertilizers for crops. They showed the products available in the factory outlet. Almost 20 products manufactured from cowdung byproducts were available for display and purchase as well.

A big potful of masala butter milk was kept where everyone drained their thirst by drinking 2 to 3 glasses. Later, lunch was provided which included rice, sambar, moongdal kheer, rasam and papad. After lunch, games were organised for students for relaxation. The event ended around 4.0pm with a final roundup where few shared their experience about the event. The students and staff reached college premises by 6pm.
